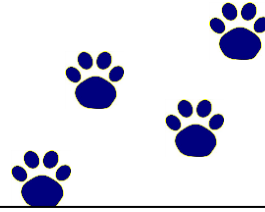

~January is National Blood Donor Month. Many lives have been saved through blood donations. Around the holiday season, demand may exceed supply. If you can, please consider voluntary blood donations. Give the gift of life by giving freely and giving often. Blood donations matter.
 ~Please continue to monitor for flu/cold symptoms. Definitely keep your child home for treatment and observation with any of these symptoms: fever greater than 100 degrees by mouth (your child may return to school only after their temperature has been below 100 degrees for a minimum of 24 hours without fever reducing medication) or experiencing vomiting, chills, fatigue, discomfort, weakness or muscle aches or frequent, congested or wet cough of lots of nasal congestion with frequent blowing of the nose.
